### **Opportunity Classes**

Opportunity classes located in government primary schools cater for academically gifted Year 5 and Year 6 students with high potential. It is a two-year placement program which covers Science and Technology, Mathematics and STEM. Parents normally apply when students are in Year 4. In the majority of cases, students who accept a place in an opportunity class will leave their current school to attend the school with an opportunity class. However, our school is currently a host school for Aurora College and therefore placement in the opportunity class allows students to participate without leaving the school.

Applications for Year 5 placement in the virtual opportunity class in 2022 open Tuesday 20 April 2021 and close at 5 pm on Friday 7 May 2021.

The Opportunity Class Placement Test for 2022 entry will be held on Wednesday 21 July 2021.

### NAPLAN Online 2021

Students from Year 3 and Year 5 participated in a trial run NAPLAN test where key issues were addressed in readiness for the online test. NAPLAN online will include tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Our school will be participating in NAPLAN Online between 11 and 21 May 2021. Excessive preparation for NAPLAN Online is not recommended. Students can use the <u>public</u> <u>demonstration site</u> to familiarise themselves with the types of questions and tools available in the NAPLAN Online tests.

### **Early Arrivals**

Some students have been arriving at the school grounds very early in the morning. Although there are staff present from 8:30am, direct supervision commences at 9am. We appreciate that many parents may have commitments at work which require them to start early and therefore we offer before and after school care OOSH service which operates within the school from 7.00am-9:30am each morning and 3:30pm – 6:30pm every afternoon. ### **COVID-19 Key Updates**

Updates from the start of Term 2, 2021 include:

- Physical distancing is now recommended rather than required where practicable.
