The Parliament & Civil Education Rebate (PACER) program is an Australian Government initiative that provides financial assistance to support students' onsite learning about national democratic, historical and cultural institutions in Canberr, the nations capital.

Stage 3 students from our school will soon be undertaking, an education tour of the national capital. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education.

To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$67.50 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs.

The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion This rebate has already been passed onto our students.

You may use the parent portal for various things, including online permission notes, attendance, and payments, which can be accessed via a secure link. The School Bytes parent portal enables you to view all your children in one portal and process payments for multiple siblings in one transaction.






